A nostalgic experience sure to bring back family memories awaits as you travel from room to room to view beautifully appointed Christmas trees, gaily decorated mantels, bright poinsettia plants, garlands adorning the staircases and doorways, and touches of old-fashioned ornamentation.

The dining room table will be set for an elegant Christmas dinner. In the Colonial kitchen, enjoy holiday cheer with a yuletide treat. Old-fashioned toys and dolls along with bright paper packages sit under the trees. Musical tributes to the season are heard on the antique piano, the soft sounds of the harp, and young voices with traditional caroling. Performers from Lincoln's Heritage Ballet bring to life the story of The Nutcracker in the festively decorated setting of Hearthside's old-fashioned Christmas home. As visitors stroll through on a self-guided, they will hear the enchanting story about the little girl named Clara who receives a Nutcracker from her godfather for Christmas as told by each of the dancers situated in rooms throughout the house. See the story's favorite characters, such as the Nutcracker soldiers, the

Mouse Queen, Clara, and the beautiful Sugar Plum Fairy magically come to life in each of the rooms. Santa will also be there to welcome children. An American Girl Doll Christmas Party

Held exclusively for our Hearthside members, the American Girl Doll Christmas Party is a charming, fun-filled afternoon for girls and their moms (and of course, their dolls). With limited space, there are two seatings being offered: at 12:30 p.m. or at 2:30 p.m. As the girls and their dolls gather around our storyteller, they learn about Young Charlotte, a tale from the 1840s that inspired the creation of a most-popular porcelain doll.

Artifacts and colorful photos help bring the historic tale to life. Also included is the oldest and most well-known Christmas poems, "The Night Before Christmas," which is also from that time period.

The party includes hot chocolate and sweets, with a surprise for the girl who discovers the little "Frozen Charlotte" doll inside her cupcake. Also a Christmas sing-along with favorites played on our antique piano, prizes, a raffle, and a small favor to bring home all add to the excitement. A visit with our Victorian Santa for the girls and their dolls and a photo to remember this special day will be treasured for years to come.
